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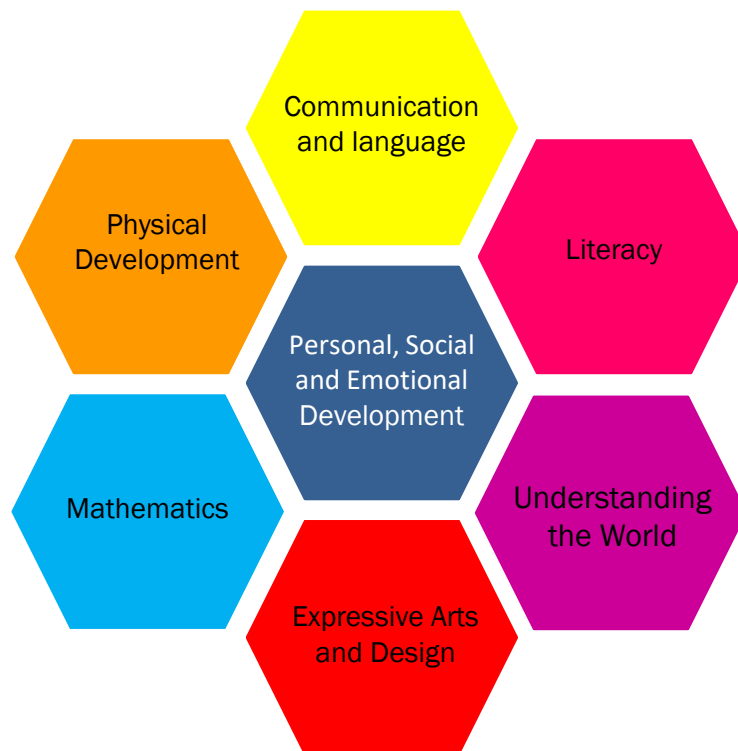

## Early Years Foundation Stage Explained

*The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) sets standards for the learning, development and care of children from birth to 5 years old to ensure that children learn and develop well, and are kept healthy and safe.*

*It promotes teaching and learning to ensure children's 'school readiness' and gives children the broad range of knowledge and skills that provide the right foundation for good future progress through school and life.*

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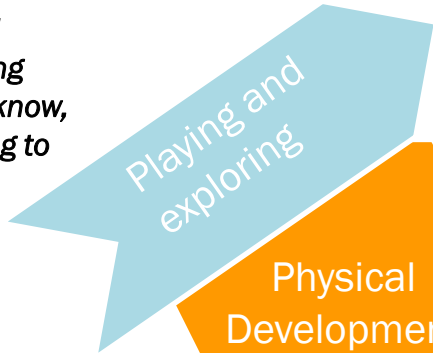
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## How characteristics of learning link with the 7 areas of development.

*Finding out and exploring, playing with what they know, and being willing to 'have a go'*



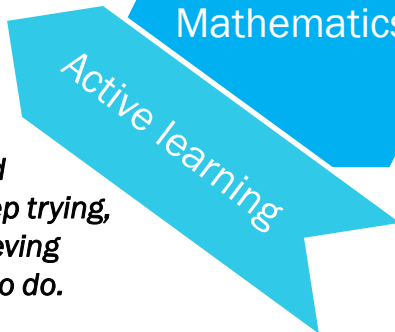
Communication and language

## THE IMPORTANCE OF PLAY

Play underpins the EYFS. It also underpins learning and all aspects of children's development. Through **play**, children develop language skills, their emotions and creativity, social and intellectual skills. For most children their play is natural and spontaneous although some children may need extra help from adults.

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## Assessment and Progress

- **Our experienced staff build relationships** with your children through quality interactions and purposeful play.
- **Our dedicated staff** use their experience and knowledge to monitor if a child's learning and development is on track for their age
- Assessment of learning is through teacher judgement with **input from all Early Years staff.**
- **RECEPTION BASELINE ASSESSMENTS take place within the first six weeks of starting school.** This is an age-appropriate assessment of early mathematics and early literacy, communication and language.
- There are **17 Early Learning Goals** which set out the expected level of attainment at the end of the EYFS.
- **EARLY YEARS PROFILE:** All children in Reception are assessed against each area of learning at the end of the year. *The assessments are based on the teacher's professional knowledge of what the child knows, remembers and can do day-to-day.* For more information you can access the handbook online <https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-profile-handbook>
- **Our ambitious curriculum** promotes a greater emphasis on **improving children's language and vocabulary** through increased opportunities for conversations, high quality key texts, exposure to a wide range of reading materials and supportive conversations during play across the curriculum.
- **TAPESTRY** is a secure online Learning Journal that we use across the Early Years, giving you an insight into the learning that takes places across Nursery and Reception.

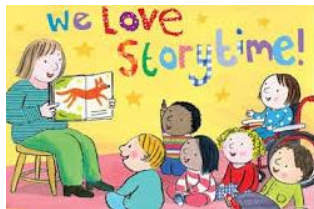

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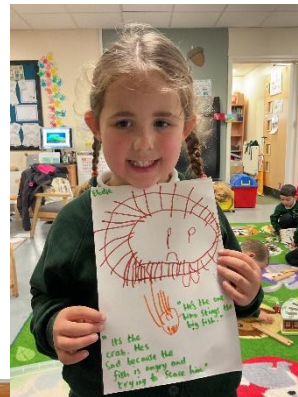


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In our Early Years settings all of our children learn a variety of skills that support them to become **Ready, Respectful, Safe** members of our school and the wider community.

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## PHONICS

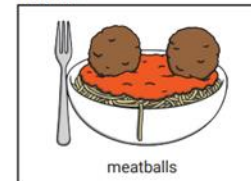
- Twinkl - Whole school synthetic phonics scheme which teaches children to read
- Taught to all children from Nursery – Year 2
- Taught as an intervention where needed for children in Years 3-6
- Daily, interactive lessons
- Songs, rhymes, actions to make learning fun and memorable
- Reading books to support current phonics learning
- ‘Crib sheets’ to bring the children’s learning home and to support parents

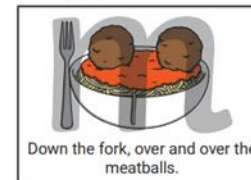
